The Master Gardener Program in Adams County started in 1997. Over 172 people have been trained since that time, and there are currently 12 certified Master Gardener Volunteers (MGVs) for 2017. The UW-Extension staff member facilitating the MG Program is Lynn Dolata.

Teaching Children About Planting Plants

Each spring the local Ace Hardware store invites children from the county to draw a picture of a flower and bring it to a workshop where they can receive and plant a free flower in a pot to take to their mother for Mother's Day. MGVs teach the children how to plant a flower of their choosing. This year approximately 300 children took part.

Students Learn in School Garden

The Adams-Friendship Elementary School has a Student Garden where students plant and care for a variety of plants such as green beans, squash, strawberries, and many types of flowers. MGVs help guide the students in planting, mulching, weeding, and maintenance throughout the growing season, helping them learn about where their food comes from and how plants grow.

Plantings Improve Quality of Life

MGVs, in cooperation with several local groups, plant and maintain decorative flower planting throughout the Adams/Friendship community including at Moundview Memorial Hospital, Adams County Community Center, The Hazel Street Farmers Market, Villa Pines Senior Living Center, Adams County Senior Center, Adams County Library, and the Adams County Fairgrounds to make the areas more inviting and pleasant for residents.

Scholarships Encourage Students in Horticulture

This year we provided three \$500 college scholarships to local students who are pursuing degrees in Horticulture, Agriculture, or other related fields. The Master Gardener Program in Adams County

ADOPT-A-HIGHWAY

The Adopt-a-Highway program is a state-wide effort for volunteers to assist the counties in maintaining our roadsides. The Adams County Highway Department is instrumental in making this program work. The volunteers provide the labor in making the Adopt-a-Highway program successful.

The Master Gardeners adopted three sections of county roads to maintain over seven years ago. Each is a two mile section on Highways B, J, and Z. What our teams do is pick up trash on each roadway section

2 to 3 times a year. The highway department provides orange caution signs, safety vests and plastic trash bags. After a pickup, we notify the highway department, and they pick up the trash bags soon after.

The state Adopt-a-Highway program defines the guidelines that we follow to ensure that volunteers are safe during our pickups. Our teams schedule a day that is convenient to do the work. The program starts on the first of April and ends at the end of October each season.

The Master Gardeners Adopt-a-Highway committee is ongoing. We are looking for volunteers to make it successful for another season. Each pickup takes 1-1 ½ hours to complete, gives you healthy exercise and volunteer hours, and is an excellent way to make new friends. Our goal is to help beautify Adams County roadways, as well as promote community awareness of keeping our environment clean.
